Goutal-Marteau Finishes 1-2 in \$10,000 Hunt & Go Stake presented by The Baran at 50th Annual Hampton Classic Horse Show

Adult Amateur Hunters Share the Spotlight

Bridgehampton, NY – August 28, 2025 – After winning Sunday's \$30,000 The Wellington Jumper Challenge, Brianne Goutal-Marteau (USA) returned to the winner's circle on Thursday at the 50th annual Hampton Classic, this time in the Aspinall Hunter Ring. She finished first and second in the \$10,000 Hunt & Go Stake presented by The Baran with two Aquitaine Equine mounts: Remedy (169 points) and Grand Remo (168 points), respectively.

Celebrating 50 years of world-class equestrian competition in 2025, the **Hampton Classic Horse Show** takes place in Bridgehampton, NY, **August 24-31**, featuring FEI CSI5* and CSI2* show jumping and USEF Premier hunter competitions with more than \$1 million in prize money. The highlight of the week is the \$400,000 Longines Hampton Classic 5* Grand Prix, one of the world's premier show jumping competitions, on Sunday, August 31.

Goutal-Marteau joined a field of 17 entries in Thursday's Hunt & Go Stake, which featured a 13-effort, 3'3" course designed by Lynn and Sarah Mullins and judged by Mark Bone and Sissy Wickes.

Consistency was key in Goutal-Marteau's victory aboard the 10-year-old Belgian Warmblood gelding *Remedy*, who had the second-highest classic phase score (84 points) and highest handy score (85 points) for a combined total of 169 points.

Goutal-Marteau also secured the highest classic phase score with the 14-year-old Dutch Warmblood gelding *Grand Remo* (85 points), but their 83-point handy score ultimately earned them second place with a combined total of 168 points. The 10-year-old Belgian Warmblood gelding *Talk*, owned by Charlotte Rossetter and ridden by Kenzie Smith of Shoreham, NY, brought home third place with a combined score of 167 points.

"Both of my horses went beautifully today," Goutal-Marteau said. "It was a really nice course, and I love the hunt-and-go format. It allows us to practice both parts of hunter life at the same time. The footing here has been great with the amazing weather, and I think the horses really appreciate that."

"The Hampton Classic is my favorite show of the year," said sponsor Kristen Baran. "There's something really special about this show because it really brings the community together. It's for everyone – the horses, the riders, and the spectators. I think it's one of the best shows in the country.

"Today's class was incredible," Baran added. "There were some interesting strategies happening in the ring. The inside turn at the final jump was challenging. Brianne went last (with *Remedy*), saw an opportunity, and gave a brilliant ride. It's wonderful to see amateurs and juniors riding alongside the

professionals and rising to the occasion. The Hampton Classic is one of the most beautiful horse shows, and we are so grateful to be here for something like this."

Sharing the spotlight throughout the day were the Adult Amateur 3' hunters, who saw several champions crowned for their respective age groups. Sunday's Grand Local Hunter Champion *Rocklyn* once again shone in the ring, securing the **Adult Amateur Hunter 50+ Championship** with owner and rider Anne Byers (Locust Valley, NY). Tom Rattigan's *Wroyal Jester* won the **Adult Amateur 36-49 Championship** with Glenda Monkarsh of Las Vegas, NV, in the irons.

The Kalvarie Group's *Kalvarie* stood above the rest with rider Madeline Briggs of Sag Harbor, NY, earning the **Grand Adult Amateur Hunter Championship** for multiple outstanding performances in the **Adult Amateur Hunter 18-35 Hunter** division.

Each year, approximately 50,000 people – including many A-list celebrities – come to watch the nation's best equestrian athletes compete at the Hampton Classic Horse Show. Rated **USEF 'Premier-6'** for hunters and jumpers with designated **FEI 2* and 5*** jumping classes, the Hampton Classic features more than 200 competitions in six spectacular show rings, the Agneta Currey Boutique Garden with more than 70 vendors, and a wide selection of dining options, all on its world-class 60-acre showgrounds.

FEI competition began on Thursday, August 28, with the \$5,000 Citarella Open Jumper CS12* and \$32,000 CS15* Two-Phase and continues throughout the weekend with seven 2*/5* classes. FEI competition also includes Friday's \$32,000 Wölffer Estate 2* Grand Prix Qualifier, \$116,100 Douglas Elliman 5* Grand Prix Qualifier, Saturday's \$62,500 5* Winning Round, and culminates with the \$70,000 Hampton Classic 2* Grand Prix and \$400,000 Longines Hampton Classic 5* Grand Prix on Sunday, August 31.

Other competition highlights include the \$30,000 The Wellington Jumper Challenge, \$10,000 Stomp Capital 1.40m Open Jumper, \$40,000 CME Group 1.45m National Grand Prix, \$10,000 Hunt & Go Stake presented by The Baran, \$10,000 Hermès Equitation Championship, \$25,000 Agneta & Brownlee Currey 1.45m Junior/Amateur Jumper Classic, and \$30,000 Longines Rider Challenges, which are now being offered as two separate bonuses: \$10,000 for the FEI 2* division and \$20,000 for the FEI 5* division.

Outside of the show rings, families can enjoy unique shopping in the Agneta Currey Boutique Garden and on Stable Row; hands-on activities, pony rides and petting zoo animals at the Kids Exhibition Tent; and many more fun activities during Kids Day (Saturday, August 30).

Daily entry to the Hampton Classic is \$25 per carload which includes grandstand seating on all days except Grand Prix Sunday. Admission is free on Monday. Admission is also free on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday for Seniors, members of the Military and those who bring three or more non-perishable food items for local food pantries.

Tickets for **reserved grandstand seats** for Grand Prix Sunday, August 31, are \$55 per seat and are available on the <u>Hampton Classic website</u>. Tickets for the Classic's new **Judge's Box Lounge**, which offers an elevated experience for watching Grand Prix Ring competition on Thursday-Sunday, August 28-31, are also available. Lounge tickets are priced at \$200 for Thursday, \$300 for Friday or Saturday, and \$600 for Grand Prix Sunday and are available on the <u>Hampton Classic website</u>.

For those who can't make it to the show grounds, <u>complimentary live webcasts</u> of all Grand Prix and Aspinall Ring competitions air on the Hampton Classic website. Produced by ClipMyHorse.TV, the Grand Prix Ring livestreams are sponsored by Longines and the Aspinall Ring livestreams are sponsored by <u>ClipMyHorse.TV</u>. In addition, WVVH-TV, Hamptons Television, broadcasts up to five hours of competition and highlights each day during the Classic. These broadcasts can also be seen online at www.wvvh.tv.
